THE AIC COLLECTION

Pioneer of Australian stand up, **Rod Quantock** says, "The collection is definitive, unsparingly comprehensive and irreplaceable historic archive of a defining Australian cultural characteristic, our unique sense of humour. To lose it would be much, much, much worse than losing your keys."

The collection of 30,000 comedy and humour books, ephemera and memorabilia, was last valued at \$2million. It was donated to the AIC by comedy guru Pete Crofts and it is a remarkable collection. Here's a little sample;

Books

- The only book written in Australia on the Psychology of Laughter, published 1933, by Ralph Piddington, and signed
 by the author
- · 'The Argument of Laughter', a legendary book published by D H Munro, 1943, signed by the author
- · 'Joe Miller's Jest Book', A facsimile of the world's first joke book ever written, published 1739
- 'Comic Encyclopedia', the first book ever written on the history of humorology, 1st edition, signed by author, Evan Esar, published 1979
- · 'Mo's Memoirs', authored by Roy Rene, 1945
- · 'The History of Court Fools', by Dr Eoran, published 1858

Memorabilia and Ephemera

- · Posters of all of Barry Humphries' and Paul Hogan's' early live shows
- Brochures from the first 3 Humour Festivals held in Melbourne in 1980-82, produced by Pete Crofts at Melbourne Uni
- Brochures from every Melbourne International Comedy Festival since 1987 and all of Judith Lucy's early public performances

Records

- More than 3000 comedy vinyl records, many of which are very rare. In fact, the definitive global book that compiles all
 the comedy records ever produced does not include at least 6 records that are included in our collection. It includes
 recordings of Roy Rene and Barry Humphries
- Famous live recording of Dr. Murray Banks, a US Professor of Psychology, at the Princes Theatre in Melbourne, discussing the psychology and relevance of humour in the late 1950's.








ABOUT OUR INSTITUTE'S BOARD

We guess you're all wondering why a group of crazy funny dudes got together in 2012 to form the institute. The answer is simple, comedians, creatives and comedy lovers wanted to preserve Australia's comedy heritage, past and future. It all began with the incredible collection belonging to comedy doyen, Mr. Pete 'Pie-on-ear' Crofts.



Pete Crofts - Founder

Pete 'you've gotta laugh' Crofts says life's too mysterious to take too serious. "After all, we live on a funny spinning planet in an ever expanding humourverse - so you've gotta laugh for the sake of world peace." Pete toured Australia for 15 years as a professional standup comedian, and is an internationally renowned humour power speaker, author, futurist and coach. In 1974 he opened the world's first bookshop specialising in humour, comedy and laughter in Melbourne. It soon became the world's first Humourversity, housing the largest book library, record collection, memorabilia and ephemera collection. Pete Pie-On-Eared Australia's first Laughter Club (1975), humour conference (Sydney Uni 1996), Humour Festivals (Melbourne Uni 1981,82), which began the momentum for what has now become the Melbourne International Comedy Festival.



Chairman: Charles Kovess

After 20 years of high level legal and business experience, Charles Kovess turned his back on the law in 1993 to share success strategies as a professional speaker, educator, facilitator and coach. Charles is known as Australasia's Passion Provocateur. Amongst a broad range of interests, Charles has promoted sustainability practices and philosophies since 1976, and challenges his audiences to passionately promote the need for sustainable behaviours. He's authored two inspirational books, 'Passionate People Produce', and 'Passionate Performance', and is the co-author of 'The 7 Heavenly Virtues of Leadership'. He's also just a little bit passionate about comedy. Pete Crofts played an important role in mentoring Charles throughout his speaking career, and taught him the value of comedy and humour in his serious presentations.



Jack Levi (aka Elliot Goblet)

After completing a university degree and corporate work in the IT Industry, Jack decided to follow his passion and do standup comedy as a career. With guidance from comedy coach Pete Crofts, he launched into Melbourne's comedy clubs and evolved the very original and successful character, Elliot Goblet. Over the last 30 years he's done over 60 stand up spots on national television including the Daryl Somers Show, then Hey Hey It's Saturday, and the Midday Show, and performed across Australia and the world. Among his proud achievements is the best-selling book, "Business According To Goblet", an Aria nominated CD called "Internally Berserk", a cameo role in the movie, "Fat Pizza" and being the support act for the band "America" during an Australian tour. He likes to break from public shows to bring funny business to serious business by performing at corporate events and weddings as an MC.
